



CITY OF MIYAZAKI

Miyazaki City, capital of Miyazaki Prefecture, is located on the south eastern coast of Kyushu. With one of the warmest climates on the main islands of Japan.

NAGASAKI

Nagasaki is an attractively situated port city on the island of Kyushu and the capital of Nagasaki Prefecture.

As one of Japan's closest port cities to the Asian mainland, Nagasaki has played a prominent role in foreign trade relations for many centuries and was the most important of only a very few ports open to restricted numbers of foreign traders during Japan's period of isolation.

In history, Nagasaki became the second city after Hiroshima to be destroyed by an atomic bomb towards the End of World War II





HAKATA – Canal City Hakata

Hakata is a district located in Hakata-ku in Fukuoka City, east of the Nakagawa River, and is one of the central areas of Fukuoka, the largest city on Kyushu.

One of the specialties is Canal City of Hakata. Visitors, who are planning on shopping, will likely be able to find something of interest in one of Canal City's many stores, whether it be in a shop unique to Japan or a branch of an international company. There is also a wide variety of restaurants, offering Japanese and international food, that generally have reasonably priced menus.

The fifth floor consists of the "Ramen Stadium", which has eight ramen shops with noodle dishes from across Japan, including the local specialty Hakata Ramen.

Canal City has been designed to create a spacious and interesting atmosphere with creative and unique colors and shapes. The artificial canal runs right through the middle of the five floored entertainment complex, creating a lot of open space. At the center of the canal there is a fountain with water shows every 30 minutes from 10:00 until 22:00.

BEPPU

Beppu is one of Japan's most famous hot spring resorts, producing more hot spring water than any other resort in the country.

Beppu offers an unmatched range of baths to be enjoyed, including ordinary hot water baths, mud baths, sand baths and steam baths. In addition, the Hells of Beppu (Beppu Jigoku) are several spectacular hot springs for viewing rather than bathing.





MOUNT ASO

Mount Aso is an active volcano in the center of Kyushu. Its ancient caldera ranks among the world's largest, with a diameter of up to 2 kilometers and a circumference of over 100 kilometers. In the center of the caldera stand the mountain's active volcanic peaks, including Mount Nakadake, whose spectacular crater is easily accessible to tourists by toll road or ropeway.

KUMAMOTO

Kumamoto is located in the center of the Kyushu island. 70% of the land is forested. Gently rolling hills can be found in the north, while to the east and the south are mountainous areas that reach heights of 1,000 meters. Kumamoto has an abundance of beautiful landscapes. The weather of Kumamoto is generally mild.
